Dear Stakeholder,

You are invited to offer public comment as outlined in this notice regarding proposed changes to Rule 4501:2-11-01 (Use of an Electronic Clearance Device) of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).

You are receiving this message pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-011K and Senate Bill 2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Division of State Highway Patrol (OSP), to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by Senate Bill 2), and provide opportunity for interested parties to submit feedback regarding proposed rules.

Pursuant to its completed Revised Code 119.032 five-year rule review, OSP proposes to rescind Rule 4501:2-11-01 while simultaneously adopting it under the same rule number as changes to the rule strike approximately half of the existing text while adding a comparable amount of new text.

New Rule 4501:2-11-01 sets forth the criteria that must be met for an electronic clearance device to be approved for use by a commercial motor vehicle operator to bypass a fixed platform scales facility. Language referencing vendors from whom devices must be purchased, PrePass System enrollment requirements, and the Ohio prepass steering committee has been deleted.
