Dear Stakeholder,

You are invited to offer public comment as outlined in this notice regarding the proposed no-change filing of Chapter 4501-11 (Funeral Escort Vehicles-Flashing Lights) of the Ohio Administrative Code ("O.A.C.").

You are receiving this message pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-011K and Senate Bill 2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Ohio State Highway Patrol ("OSHP"), to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by Senate Bill 2), and provide opportunity for interested parties to submit feedback regarding proposed rules.

In accordance with section 4513.181 of the Revised Code ("R.C."), funeral establishments are permitted, but not required, to use flashing lights on their funeral escort vehicles. O.A.C. Chapter 4501-11 sets forth the requirements for such lighting if a funeral establishment chooses to use it. Pursuant to its completed R.C. 106.03 periodic rule review, OSHP has determined that the rules remain necessary, but are without need of amendment at this time. Therefore, OSHP proposes to file Chapter 4501-11 without change.
