Dear Stakeholder,

You are invited to offer public comment as outlined in this notice regarding the proposed adoption of Rule 4501:1-3-12, "Administrative penalties," to the Ohio Administrative Code. Rule 4501:1-3-12 is proposed to implement provisions of House Bill 318 (130<sup>th</sup> General Assembly) pertaining to new motor vehicle dealer shows and displays.

You are receiving this message pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-01K and Senate Bill 2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Motor Vehicles ("BMV"), to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by Senate Bill 2), and provide opportunity for interested parties to submit feedback regarding proposed rules.

Rule 4501:1-3-12 establishes that, pursuant to adjudication conducted in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, the Motor Vehicle Dealers Board may order a person to pay an administrative penalty of not more than five hundred dollars for the first violation and not more than one thousand dollars for subsequent violations of section [4517.22](#) (Motor vehicle shows) or section [4517.221](#) (Display of new motor vehicles at location other than dealership) of the Revised Code.
