Dear Stakeholder,

You are invited to offer public comment as outlined in this notice regarding proposed changes to Chapter 4501-21 (Remedial Driving Courses), of the Ohio Administrative Code.

You are receiving this message pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-011K and Senate Bill 2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Division of Criminal Justice Services (CJS), to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by Senate Bill 2), and provide opportunity for interested parties to submit feedback regarding proposed rules.

Pursuant to legislative provisions of Senate Bill 19 of the 129th General Assembly, CJS proposes to amend Chapter 4501-21 to incorporate advanced juvenile driver improvement into the remedial driving course program. Proposed amendments set forth the requirements for advanced juvenile driver improvement course curriculum and instruction, instructor and chief instructor training, application and renewal processes for instructors and enterprises, as well requirements for closed-course facility ranges.
