Dear Stakeholder:

You are invited to offer public comment as outlined in this notice regarding proposed changes to Chapter 4501:1-8 (International Registration Plan), of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).

You are receiving this message pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-011K and Senate Bill 2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by Senate Bill 2), and provide opportunity for interested parties to submit feedback regarding proposed rules.

Rule 4501:1-8-02 (Definitions) is being amended to align with recent changes to section 4501.01 of the Revised Code which no longer excludes buses used in the transportation of chartered parties from the definition of an apportionable vehicle. Rules 4501:1-8-08 (Initial and supplemental application for registration in international registration plan) and 4501:1-8-11 (Temporary authority and permits to operate apportioned vehicles) are being amended to align with the decision International Registration Plan, Inc (IRP) to implement Full Reciprocity Plan (FRP) between jurisdictions and the granting of Temporary Authority (T.A.) extensions.
