Dear Stakeholder,

You are invited to offer public comment as outlined in this notice regarding the proposed filing of Chapter 4501-8 (Abbreviated Adult Driver Training) of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) pursuant to the passing of recent legislation, House Bill 53, 131st General Assembly.

You are receiving this message pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-011K and Senate Bill 2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Services ("OCJS"), to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by Senate Bill 2), and provide opportunity for interested parties to submit feedback regarding proposed rules.

OAC Chapter 4501-8 sets forth the requirements to become certified as an abbreviated adult driver training school and addresses training requirements for adult coordinators and instructors. Pursuant to its rule review, OCJS proposes to adopt rules under Chapter 4501-8 to address materials incorporated by reference in compliance with R.C. 121.71 to 121.74, provide course curriculum topics, require specific training for instructors, set forth application processes, and require probationary licenses for new instructors.

All interested parties are invited to submit public comment regarding the proposed rule filing to the Office of Criminal Justice Services and the Common Sense Initiative Office, which governs the state's regulatory process. **Public comments may be submitted through 11:59 p.m. on January 22, 2016.**
