Dear Stakeholder,

You are invited to offer public comment as outlined in this notice regarding proposed amendments to Rule 4501:1-2-02 of the Ohio Administrative Code, entitled “Proof of Financial Responsibility.”

You are receiving this message pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-011K and Senate Bill 2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by Senate Bill 2), and provide opportunity for interested parties to submit feedback regarding proposed rules.

Rule 4501:1-2-02 sets forth specific rules for the form and content of the financial responsibility card. The proposed amendments will allow insurance companies to issue, and insurance customers to use, proof of financial responsibility in electronic form in addition to paper and plastic financial responsibility identification cards already in use.
