RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the crime of sexual assault leaves victims, their families, friends, co-workers, neighbors, and entire communities less secure; and

WHEREAS, crimes include, but are not limited to: rape; sexual battery; gross sexual imposition; and unlawful sexual conduct with a minor, which encompasses types of sexual assault that impact many Ohioans; and

WHEREAS, Ohio law enforcement agencies reported 8,333 sexual assaults in 2012; and

WHEREAS, crime exacts an emotional, physical, psychological, and financial toll on victims and their sense of security; and

WHEREAS, 85 percent of rape or other sexual assault victims in 2012 were female and 15 percent of rape or other sexual assaults were male victims; and

WHEREAS, in 21 percent of the sexual assault incidences, the victim and suspect were family members; and

WHEREAS, in 76 percent of the incidents, the victim and suspect were not family members, but they knew each other; and

WHEREAS, 20 percent of women will be the victim of attempted or actual sexual assault when they get to college, as will about 6 percent of undergraduate men; and

WHEREAS, statistics for men and boys survivors of sexual assault may be much higher as a result of underreporting; and


WHEREAS, this month provides our state an opportunity to bring about awareness, intervention and prevention strategies that impact all sectors of our population regardless of age, gender, race, ethnicity, and sexual orientation when addressing the crime of sexual assault in our communities.
