Firefighter I curriculum.

(A) A training program for firefighter I certification shall consist of the following training requirements: ~~not less than one hundred twenty hours and meet all objectives in the NFPA standard 1001, firefighter I. In addition, students must also successfully complete a sixteen-hour emergency vehicle operation course approved by the chartered program that meets the requirements of NFPA standards 1451 and 1002.~~

(1) A training program consisting of not less than one hundred thirty six hours, which meets all objectives in the NFPA standard 1001, firefighter 1;

(2) An emergency vehicle operator course consisting of not less than sixteen hours that is approved by the chartered program and meets the requirements of the NFPA standards 1002 and 1451;

(3) A four hour "National Fallen Firefighter Foundation, Courage to be Safe: Sixteen Life Safety Initiatives" (<http://everyonegoeshome.com/>) program as approved by the executive director.

(B) The training listed in paragraph (A) of this rule shall commence and end within a consecutive twelve-month period.

(C) A chartered program shall issue a document of course completion to each student who successfully completes the firefighter I course and provides written documentation of successful completion of the following training courses:

National incident management system course IS-700 and incident command system course IS-100, both of which can be accessed at the federal emergency management agency web site (<http://training.fema.gov/emiweb/IS/crslist.asp>) for online courses or (http://www.fema.gov/emergency/nims/nims_compliance.shtm (March 1, 2004) for materials and information on instructor ~~lead~~ led classroom-based courses). These courses are also listed on the division of ~~plae~~ EMS web site (<http://www.ems.ohio.gov>).
