Statement from Ohio Homeland Security Executive Director Robert C. Glenn

“The death of Osama bin Laden marks a significant victory in the fight against al-Qa’ida. Our counter terrorism efforts and vigilance will continue, because the organization of al-Qa’ida and those inspired by it remain, as does our unified resolve against terrorism.”

“Currently, there are no active alerts of the National Terrorism Advisory System (NTAS). Ohio Homeland Security and the state fusion center (Strategic Analysis and Information Center) will continue to monitor these events and provide more information as it becomes available in concert with federal, state and local partners.”

“Ohioans are our most important homeland security partners, and they should continue to be vigilant and report suspicious activity to law enforcement or the Ohio Homeland Security terrorism tip line 1-877-OHS-INTEL.”
