

Alcohol Server Knowledge Course



The Ohio Investigative Unit (OIU), the Ohio State Highway Patrol, the University of Toledo and local law enforcement are teaming up to provide liquor permit holders and their employees with a free training on Ohio's liquor laws.

The training will be held: **Monday, October 7, 6 – 8 p.m.**
At the Driscoll Center, 2800 West Bancroft, on the University of Toledo's main campus

Each year, billions of dollars are lost due to alcohol-related crime, traffic crashes and fatalities nationwide. Last year in Ohio, 42 percent of all fatalities were alcohol related. Through this training, permit holders and their employees will be given the educational resources to understand Ohio's liquor laws, and help to end this growing epidemic.

Our goal is to work with area permit holders on education and training, rather than taking enforcement action to fix any common practices that may break the law.

This training will also feature Dr. and Mrs. Hoeflinger, who recently lost their son in an alcohol-related crash. Their message is impactful and stresses the importance of keeping alcohol out of the hands of underage patrons.
