Agents Charge Carryout Owner with Food Stamp Fraud for the Second Time in a Year

(Columbus) – Just months after agents with the Ohio Department of Public Safety's Ohio Investigative Unit charged an owner of a Toledo-area carryout with food stamp fraud, agents began another investigation.

On Wednesday, agents took enforcement action - for the second time in a year - at, Say Inc., also known as Shop-Shop, 520 Madison Ave., in Toledo. The most recent case was opened after agents received tips that the location was continuing to traffic food stamp benefits.

Angela H. Nahle, 51, of Toledo, was taken into custody after an arrest warrant through Toledo Municipal Court was issued for four counts of illegal use of food stamps. In July Angela Nahle plead guilty in Toledo Municipal Court to three counts of illegal use of food stamp/WIC program benefits. She was sentenced to three-years of probation in August.

Charges were also filed today on John H. Nahle, 18, also of Toledo, on two counts of illegal use of food stamps.
