(COLUMBUS) – Today, the Ohio Department of Public Safety’s (ODPS) Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS) hosts the “Educating the Mature Driver” Conference free of charge to individuals either certified or interested in becoming certified in providing the Mature Operator Course through their driving school or interested in learning more about mature driver needs in general.

“OCJS is deeply committed to improve the way we educate people about safe driving,” said OCJS Executive Director Karhlton Moore. “This conference not only educates the driving instructors but others who are committed to learning how to keep our drivers safe.”

Julie Dominik, Occupational Therapist and Certified Driver Rehabilitation Specialist, discussed safe driving techniques for seniors. Ms. Dominik is also a driving instructor for persons with disabilities.

During the conference, attendees will also have the opportunity to take part in a hands-on experience with the Car-Fit Program, which will teach drivers how to adjust mirrors, seats, and other features of the vehicle.
