Response to Mass Shootings

Preparation and Preplanning is the key to Mass Shooting Incidents. Recent mass shootings in the United States and abroad have demonstrated the need for more education, training and preparation at the local, state and federal level to respond safely to these incidents. Mass shootings have always been listed as low frequency but couldn't be ignored. Recently we have witnessed more Terrorist Threats, Criminal Attacks and Active Shooter Incidents both in the U.S. and abroad. These incidents have occurred at general assemblies, schools and colleges, churches, industrial facilities and political gatherings. **Public Safety Officials must be prepared!** During this session we will discuss Preplanning, Preparation, Interagency Cooperation, Incident Command, Resources Utilization, Rapid Response, Multi-Agency Response, Equipment Staging, Crime Scene, Responder Safety and the importance of conducting a Critique and Debriefing. The intent of this session is to learn as much as possible from the recent Mass Shooting events.
