More than 17 million U.S. children live more than one hour from a pediatric trauma center by ground or air transportation. This severely hinders access to care on a national level. In Ohio, many community hospitals provide superb care for uncomplicated injuries, and all six of Ohio's full-service children's hospitals are verified as either Level I or Level II pediatric trauma centers. The Ohio Children's Hospital Association website reports that Ohio is the only state in the union where any child is within a two-hour drive to a pediatric hospital. How does immediate access to pediatric trauma care play out in Ohio?
