Introductions

TOPIC	<p>Mr. Resanovich welcomed attendees and requested they introduce themselves and the organization they represent.</p> <p><u>ACTION:</u> <i>Motion to approve the Active Shooter Response Ad-hoc committee minutes of December 8, 2016 and January 19, 2017. Mr. Gerstner – First. Mr. Martin - Second. None opposed. None abstained. Motion approved.</i></p> <p>Mr. Resanovich explained that the EMFTS Board approved this committee to have up to 20 members. The EMFTS Board approved 16 members on February 18, 2017.</p> <p>The Executive Summary will be submitted to the EMFTS Board on April 19, 2017. Corrections to the executive summary were suggested and discussed by the committee members.</p> <p><u>ACTION:</u> <i>Motion to approve the Executive Summary of the Active Shooter Response Ad-hoc committee with the suggested corrections. Mr. Gerstner – First. Dr. Pellegrino - Second. None opposed. None abstained. Awareness Training Discussion

TOPIC

A suggestion was made that the Awareness Training be approved by O.P.O.T.A so those who take the course can receive credit.

Chief Scott informed the committee that the Notre Dame College is hosting the Active Shooter Events Response and CRASE Course for free on May 11th and 12th. Committee members may attend both days; however, Mr. Resanovich suggested that the committee have the Active Shooter Response Ad-hoc committee meeting after the course on May 12th. Chief Scott will send Ms. Koker the information and registration form to disseminate to the committee members.

The committee reviewed a power point in reference to how law enforcement responds to these incidents.

The committee reviewed a video regarding the RTF awareness training in eastern Cuyahoga County.

A workgroup was appointed and will meet March 3, 2017 in Ashland, Ohio to begin compiling all of the information into one power point presentation for the awareness training.

Mr. Resanovich and Mr. Dutton will create a survey for all of the stakeholder organizations.

A discussion ensued as to creating a tabletop exercise that is generic and can be used as a guideline for each region.
