An Overview of Trauma Mortality Trends in Select Urban Counties in Ohio

The table below presents annual mortality of injured patients in select urban counties of Ohio. These data were derived from the Acute Care module of the Ohio Trauma Registry (OTR).

Percentages were calculated by dividing the number of trauma victims reported to OTR who died by the total number of trauma victims reported in each county each year. These are crude mortality rates, meaning that no adjustments were made for factors that may affect the rates, such as injury severity or type, or a victim's age.
