

## BEWARE THE FLASHLIGHT

There is a new flashlight on the market that detects the scent of alcohol. Police departments around the nation have been using the device which makers say does the same thing as a nose. It is a tiny battery-operated device on the end of a flashlight which can determine the presence of alcohol on the breath of a driver or anywhere else in a vehicle.

In Monroeville, Ohio, a police officer recently pulled over a tractor-trailer for speeding, and the officer used the flashlight. The device alerted him that there was alcohol in the cab even though the officer couldn't smell anything. The driver failed the field sobriety test and had a BAC of .18 percent.

Troopers have tested them at sobriety checkpoints. They were given several flashlights by Mothers Against Drunk Driving, but they aren't being used because of concerns about reliable readings. Also, there are no guarantees that the readings would be legal to use in court, according to patrol spokesperson Lt. Gary Lewis. Most importantly, the patrol doesn't want to risk losing a drunken driving conviction because evidence was thrown out.

Monroeville police said they won't use the results in court but feel it is like a tool to give a first alert that there may be a problem.

According to PAS Systems International of Fredericksburg, Virginia, which makes the P.A.S. III Sniffer, the constitutionality of the device has never been tested in court. *(source: adapted from AP article)*

## MANY TEENS UNAWARE of Zero Tolerance Laws

All 50 states have a zero tolerance law that says that drivers younger than 21 are prohibited from driving with any measurable alcohol. Zero tolerance sets a maximum BAC of 0.02 or less for drivers under age 21 and suspends or revokes an offender's driver license. But a study done by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) finds that awareness of these laws is limited among young drivers.

It is up to traffic safety groups, law enforcement agencies and civic organizations to help spread the word to teens through schools, youth organizations and others.

At the Ohio Department of Public Safety, several specific programs encourage teens not to drink and drive. One is "The Sober Truth" program and another is the "Students Make a Right Turn (SMART)" program and a third is the "None for Under 21" program.

The Sober Truth program, established in 1976, is presented by enforcement agents to educate Ohio's youth on the state's liquor and tobacco laws and the penalties for violating these laws. Enforcement agents make presentations to schools and other youth groups. For more information on this program, contact the ODPS Communications office at 614/466-4344.

The SMART program began in 2000 and is offered by the Governor's Highway Safety Office (GHSO). This program initiative provides materials on a number of safety issues, including impaired and aggressive driving, the benefits of using occupant restraints, and information on other risk-taking behaviors. The program was designed to empower youth and their peers to make wise traffic-related decisions. Program materials are packaged in a SMART folder and include fact sheets, brochures, newsletters and stickers. These materials are made available free of charge upon request. A quarterly newsletter is also provided as a service. For more information on the SMART program, please call the GHSO at 614/466-3250.

The "None for Under 21 (NFU21)" program kicks off in April each year and emphasizes not drinking and driving during the prom and graduation season. The campaign encourages students to *wait* until they are legal drinking age, *learn* about the effects and consequences and *live* life to the fullest by saying "no."
