RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, domestic violence, also known as intimate partner violence, can happen to anyone of any race, age, ability, sexual orientation, religion, nationality or gender; it crosses all socio-economic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, there were 71,733 victims of domestic violence reported to law enforcement in Ohio. These crimes resulted in 84 victim fatalities. There were countless other victims who did not report the crime; and

WHEREAS, to raise awareness about domestic violence, the state of Ohio is participating in the 31st Annual National Domestic Violence Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of the “Barbara Warner Workplace Domestic Violence Policy” under Executive Order 2008-08S demonstrates the State’s commitment to working with all State agencies, boards and commissions to create and to foster safe working environments, while also working with State employees to prevent the abuse, harassment and discrimination that may be the results of domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, communities, businesses, local governments, law enforcement and individuals need to work together to stop violence in homes, schools, and workplaces; and


